NATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP AWARENESS WORKSHOP SUCCESSFULLY ORGANIZED IN PORT BLAIR

The A&N Administration in collaboration with the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE), Government of India, conducted a highly successful National Apprenticeship Awareness Workshop at the Lemon Tree Hotel, Port Blair on 27th July 2023, from 10:00 am to 04:00 pm.

The workshop received esteemed presence, with Shri. B S Jaglan, IAS, Secretary (Labour, Employment & Training), A & N Administration, gracing the event as the Chief Guest. Shri. Anil Kumar, Deputy Director General (DDG), South, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE), Government of India, was the Guest of Honor for the workshop.
