Skill Upgradation Training on Artificial Insemination Conducted at Veterinary Hospital, Junglighat

A one-day training programme was successfully conducted at the Veterinary Hospital, Junglighat, aimed at updating the knowledge and enhancing the practical skills of field veterinary staff in Artificial Insemination (AI) in cattle. The programme was part of the department's continuous efforts to strengthen livestock services and improve genetic potential in the bovine population of the islands.

The training session focused on advanced techniques of AI, semen handling and storage, reproductive health management, and record maintenance. Emphasis was laid on ensuring timely and hygienic insemination practices for better conception rates.



One hour training was imparted by Dr Dawande Kuldip N, Senior Veterinary Officer, Veterinary hospital, Junglighat whereas was demonstrated the procedures and shared insights on troubleshooting reproductive disorders in field conditions.

Ten para-vets from junglighat & rinderpest unit actively participated in the session. Participants appreciated the hands-on training and interactive discussions, which helped refresh their technical knowledge.
