<u>Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services Conducts</u> Egg Distribution and Tree Planting in Arong, Car Nicobar

The Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services (AH&VS), Andaman and Nicobar Administration, in collaboration with the Forest Department, conducted an initiative in Arong village, Car Nicobar, to distribute table eggs to school children and plant fruit-bearing and fodder trees at the Composite Livestock Farm (CLF), Arong. The event aimed to enhance child nutrition and promote sustainable agricultural practices in the region.

Table eggs were distributed to school children in the presence of members of the Tribal Council, the Education Officer In-Charge, teachers, students, and the Captain of Arong village.
