# CHAPTER 11 EDUCATION

The importance of education in fostering socio-economic growth is well recognized and accepted. Education has not only a direct role in Human Resource Development but also plays a critical facilitative role in almost all developmental aims. Improved educational attainment has significant linkage with many other indicators of social well being.

# **Evolution of Education**

The evolution of education in A & N Islands dates back to the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century when the first Primary school in the Islands was established. Later this Institution was upgraded to the status of a High school with English as its medium of instruction and Urdu as a major language. The High School at Port Blair was then affiliated to Rangoon University but with the separation of Myanmar (Burma) from India, this affiliation was transferred to Calcutta University in 1936. Till 1947 there was no Education department in this Islands and the Deputy Commissioner of the Islands was functioning as the controlling officer of the Education Department in his capacity as President of Education Advisory Committee. In the year 1946, 12 Schools were functioning comprising one High School, One Middle School, Eight Primary School and One each of Karen and Burmese school. The Educational needs of the territory could receive earnest attention only after Independence. During the year 1948-49, a total 20 educational institutions were functioning with an enrollment of 1620 students and 51 teaching staff. Awareness for education among the re-settled people and increased budgetary provision has ensured substantial growth in the sphere of education in the A & N Islands. This has grown to 420 institutions with 86117 enrolment and 4642 teachers as on 2007-08.

The Human Development Index (HDI) of A & N Islands in various fronts stands better than the mainland parts. The Literacy rate for the UT (81.3%) has improved substantially between 1981 & 2001. The A & N Islands now Ranks 8<sup>th</sup> in Literacy among various States/UT in the country. The gap between the Male & Female Literacy has narrowed down from 17% in 1981 to less than 11% in 2001. Similarly the Rural-Urban disparity in literacy has also declined from 11% in 1991 to about 8% in 2001. The Gross Enrolment (GE) in Elementary schools (Primary & Middle) recoded impressive increase between 1981 & 2001 with 88.99 % GE in the age group of 6-14 years as against 81.58% for All India in 2001-02. The School Drop out in A & N Islands has declined over the two decades and it is significantly lower than All India average. The Teacher Pupil Ratio of A & N Islands stands at 1:18 as against the all India figure of 1:40.



### **Elementary/Secondary Education**

The Govt. of India attached great importance to the elementary education and has accepted the Universalization of Elementary Education (UEE) as the National goal wherein free and compulsory education of satisfactory quality should be provided to all children up to the age of 14 years. For this purpose a new scheme viz. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) has been evolved to pursue the UEE in a mission mode. The goals of SSA are: that all children in the age group of 6 to 14 (i) are in the School/ Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) Centre/Alternative Innovative Education (AIE) Centers by 2003 (ii) complete 5 years of Primary education by 2007 (iii) complete 8 years of schooling by 2010. We, in the Islands have almost achieved the target of 100% enrolment of all the out of school children despite various constraints like natural calamities, geographical spread, remoteness and isolation of Islands, transport and communication associated problems and maintain the retention level by extending various incentives and adopting various strategies/ interventions to check the drop out rates and improve the level of achievements/guality of education in the schools. It is not only a pedagogic challenge but also a challenge to the entire set up of the education system.

The department of Education continues to impart in service training to its teachers/ Heads of institutions with a view to update their knowledge content and teaching methodology in various subjects in collaboration with UNICEF/ NIEUPA/NCERT etc. The department has already initiated action to remold the Primary Education (for class I & II) under the Multi Grade / Multi Level Methodology developed by Rishy Valley Education Resources (RIVER), Madanapally, Andhra Pradesh. Many teachers and officers of the department have undergone necessary training at RIVER and similar model of teaching/learning environment is proposed to be created in some of the schools in the Islands on Pilot project basis and we hope to address the cry for quality education in the elementary stages of education. The department continues to provide school education in 5 mediums of instruction viz Hindi, English, Tamil, Telugu and Bengali through a network of 412 educational institutions with an enrolment of about 86000 children.

The department has given priority to Science/Computer Education and elearning by establishing necessary infrastructure in all the schools in a phased manner and implementing Continuity Information Centre (CIC) Vidhya Vahim Project, a centrally sponsored project implemented by the Govt. of India in 41 Secondary/Sr. Secondary schools. The CBSE class X result for the academic year 2007-08 has shown the best result in the last 16 years (56.45%) and 84.13 % in Clas XII during the same period.

The department is also giving due importance to Sports/Games and Physical Education activities. During the academic year 2006-07 several sporting events were organized involving students at various zonal levels and sponsored various teams to participate in various National level events. The prestigious 53<sup>rd</sup> National School Football championship for boys Under 17 years was organized at Port Blair during December 2007 and A & N Islands School Team won the prestigious Trophy.

# School Enrolment

The school enrolment during the year 2007-08 was 86117 consisting of 41560 girls nearly 48%. 6071 students were from ST category of which 2868 were girls (47.24%). The primary stage enrolment during the said period was 36637, the Middle stage enrolment was 22448, the secondary stage enrolment was 13175 and the Sr. Secondary stage enrolment was 7727. The statement 11.4 to 11.9 shows various data in enrolment over the period of time stage wise, district wise block and class wise.

# **Gross Enrolment Ratio**



# Schools by Management – 2007-2008




# **Results of Class X & XII**

The results of Secondary and Senior Secondary level conducted by CBSE, the pass percentage during the year 2007-08 was 56.45 of which was 33.86 % during 1999-2000 for Secondary level examination and 84.13% during 2007-08 as compared to 73.27% during 1999-2000. During 2007-08 5463 students appeared in Secondary Examination and 3213 appeared in Sr. Secondary Examination.

# **Computer Education**

There are two main projects implemented in the islands

(i) Computer Education Project - To promote computer literacy among classes VI to XII and for teachers 24 Senior Secondary schools have covered under the project.

(ii) Community Information Centre – Vidya Vahini Project (CIC-VV) The aim of the project is to promote ICT based education and training to the students and teachers and provide internet connectivity through VSAT. 41 Schools/locations (through ERNET India) have been covered under the scheme.

# Vocational Education

Three schools in the Islands are providing vocational education at Senior Secondary level. The following table shows the vocational courses conducted and enrolment during 2007-08 in respective schools.

### **Drop out from Schools**

During 2007-08 the drop out from Primary level was 10.45%, Middle level 8.93% and 20.45 in Secondary level. The girls drop out was on the higher side in primary level and secondary level as compared to boys. 11.20% dropped out at primary level, 6.7% at Middle level and 17.09 at Secondary level.

Among the ST students the drop out was 21.61% at primary level. The dropout among the girls was 24.05% for the primary level. At Middle level there was no drop out among ST students. Whereas at the Secondary level the drop out of ST was 18.13% and the girls dropout was 19.01%.

### Mid Day Meal Programme

National programme of Nutritional support to Primary Education (NPNSPE) is implemented in 30 Govt. and Govt. aided schools in the Islands.

Cooked Mid day meal was provided to 30854 students of primary stage and 19585 students of Middle stage during 2007-08.

#### **Text Book Bureau**

He Department has established a Text Book Bureau for procurement and Distribution of Textbooks prescribed by NCERT/CBSE which also includes distribution of text books to students of BPL families. During the year 2007-08, 44987 students were provided with free textbooks. In addition 5027 girl students were provided with free text books from classes I to VIII irrespective of parental income.

#### Library Services

In the Islands there is a State library, a District library, 13 Zonal libraries and a mobile library. The membership in the libraries during 2007-08 was 19152 and having more than 104035 book in English and 10 regional languages.

### State Institute of Education (SIE)

State Institute of Education conducts in service orientation courses/ workshops for teachers of different subjects in collaboration with National level Education Institutions like NCERT, RIE, CBSE etc. The SIE also conducts examination for Andaman & Nicobar Board of Examination for teacher Education. Talent search examinations are also conducted by SIE.

#### Higher & Technical Education

There are four Degree colleges imparting Under-graduate and postgraduate courses of which three are government colleges and of this one imparts Teacher education at Degree level. The total enrolment in the year 2007-08 in higher education was 2761. The enrolment of female was 1580(57.2%). The enrolment during 2003-04 was 2444 and the female enrolment was 1302 (53.27%). The faculty strength was 130 of which 121 are under government. Two Government Polytechnics impart various technical courses of Diploma level. The enrolment during 2007-08 was 648 which was 376 during 2003-04.

District Institute of education and Training (DIET) conducts 2 years Junior Basic Training Course. The enrolment during 2007-08 was 119 of which 84 were female.

Industrial Training Institute (ITI) imparts various job- oriented vocational courses. The enrolment in ITI during 2007-08 was 209 which was 160 in 2003-04.

### Adult Education

Adult Education programme was launched in the Islands since 1997 under National Programme NLM to remove illiteracy. At present 35 Jana Siksha Nilayam and 35 EGS/ AIE centres which has enrolment of 525 and 579 adults respectively.

### **Sports activities in Schools**

Sports & games in schools is complimenting to overall development of the students and also to identify the talents of sports among them. The students of Port Blair lifted the 53<sup>rd</sup> SGFI National School football Championship which was held at Port Blair during Dec.2007 in which 16 States participated. The students are given regular chance to participate in the National and International tournaments.

#### **Expenditure in Education**

During the year 2007-08 the Plan expenditure on education was Rs.5622.43 lakhs which is the lst year of Xlth Five Year Plan as compared to Rs.4674.18 lakhs during 2002-03 which was the lst Year of X the Five Year plan. An amount of Rs. 6699 lakh has been provided in 2008-09 under Annual Plan.

During the X th Plan (2002-07) Rs. 28344 lakh was provided under Education sub-sector and Rs. 40965 lakh has been proposed during XI the Plan(2007-12)

During the year 2008-09 Rs 15517 lakh has been provided for Education sub-Sector of which Rs. 7586 lakh (49%) has been provided for Primary education, Rs.4981.32 lakh (32%) has been provided for Secondary Education, Rs 1338.69(9(%) has been kept for Higher education and Rs 1168 for Technical Education and balance 3 % for other educational activities.
