Without using explosives, the hard rock cannot be extracted. By using Hitachi and other machineries the first/top layers of quarry products only can be extracted, and it is not feasible/suitable for the marine nature of works, where it is to be utilized in open sky nature. Letter sent to MoPSW on 11.02.2022 & 17.02.2022 vide Ltr. NoALHW/TECH/6(136)/2020/337 & 288 with a request to take up the projects by calling of E-tender with mainland quarry products. Reply awaited. Regarding exploring the option of rehabilitation of the population / houses available at the project site ALHW quoted the Chief Captain of Tribal Council's request, that considering the Historic reasons and sentimental attachments with the Mus Village, even after affecting Tsunami also, the villagers are reluctant to leave their inhabitant / plantation in the village, and hence, requests to consider the sentiments of their villagers without hurting and to protect the Mus village by constructing Sea Wall.
